Licensure renewal opens Nov. 1

The Department's online application system opens Nov. 1 for licensure renewal applications. Educators whose licenses expire June 30, 2022, can avoid the rush by submitting their applications early, provided they have met renewal requirements.

Below are tips for avoiding application processing delays:

 Create an OHID account. The Department transitioned from SAFE to OHID in May 2019.
 Educators who have not yet created an OHID account will not be able to access the online application.

Changes to Your Charter? What Should You Do?



The charter contract between your school and St. Aloysius defines the academic and non-academic expectations with clear, measurable and meaningful outcomes for

students and the operational integrity of the school as a public school in Ohio. Contract Amendments, also referred to as contract modifications, are sometimes needed because of a change in law or occasional material changes to school plans or contract attachments (such as, but not limited to, revised lease agreements, revised code of regulations, revised education plan, revised management agreements, revised admissions policy, additional levels, grade etc.) Ideally, modifications are carried out to better serve students or improve operations. Modifications to the contract are detailed in Article XI of your sponsor contract.

Modifications need to be agreed to in writing and executed by both parties. Contract modifications cannot occur without prior approval of the sponsor. It is imperative that before any modifications are voted on by the governing authority and implemented by the school there should be a discussion between the school leadership, governing authority and sponsor. College Credit Plus Mature Content Permission Slip Available

As of Oct. 1, Ohio colleges, universities and secondary schools must provide information about mature subject matter in college courses to students applying to participate in College Credit Plus and their parents or guardians, as required by Ohio law.

The Ohio Department of Higher Education, in collaboration with the Ohio Department of Education, has developed and posted the required permission slip and supporting documents to aid in the implementation of this new requirement.

- <u>Update background checks</u>. Educators must have current background checks on file with the Department.
- <u>Prepare Transcripts</u>. Educators renewing with college coursework should view <u>Instructions for</u> <u>Submitting Transcripts</u> before starting the online application.

NEW Transportation Compliance Monitoring Process

The Ohio Department of Education Office of Field Services and Transportation has a new compliance monitoring system for school district pupil transportation that includes a formal complaint process that may be used by parents or community or nonpublic schools to report instances of non-compliance with transportation requirements.

To file a formal complaint regarding the required transportation services of a school district:

- Download and complete the Complaint Form (Non-Compliance Investigation Document). Be sure to check the applicable box to indicate which issue your child or schools is facing and include in the appropriate comment box the following information:
 - 1. The date that the alleged violation began
 - 2. The name of the community or nonpublic school and the name of school district responsible for providing the transportation.
 - 3. Include any additional information that pertains to the complaint in comment section next to the identified Ohio Revised Code.
- Email the complaint form to <u>TransportationCompliance@education.ohio.gov</u> and copy our office at <u>cskaggs@charterschoolspec.com</u>.
- The Office of Field Services and Transportation will confirm the receipt of the complaint within 3 days and begin to investigate based on the information provided.
- A determination of non-compliance will be made within 10 business days from the receipt of the complaint form and all
 parties will receive a communication in writing of that decision.

Security Grant Funding Now Available for Preschools, Nonpublic Schools and Nonprofits

Ohio's Safety and Security Grant Program funding now is available for safety and security enhancements at religious institutions, chartered nonpublic schools, licensed preschools and nonprofit organizations. The grants will be administered by the Ohio Emergency Management Agency with support from Ohio

Ohio Vax-2-School is an opt-in program. Parent or legal guardians of registered minors or adults under a guardianship must be validate information before award of a prize. The entry form for Ohioans 12 to 17 years old must include parent or legal guardian information, including the minor's name, phone number and email address. 


Free Safety Assessment and Intervention Trainings Available

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Covid-19 Reporting for FY2021-2022

Believe it or not, we are still collecting COVID-19 cases for our schools. Currently, we are actively lobbying for a temporary remote learning option for the 2021-2022 school year. The cases you report will help us in pushing for this option!



Please continue with the steps below:

- 1. Within twenty-four (24) hours of becoming aware of a student, teacher, staff member or coach who has tested positive or been diagnosed with COVID-19, notify parents/guardians of the COVID-19 case.
- 2. Within twenty-four (24) hours of becoming aware of a student, teacher, staff member or coach who has tested positive or been diagnosed with COVID-19, report the case to the local health department.
- 3. Report all student or staff member cases to your sponsor at coronavirus@charterschoolspec.com.
