Department to Release Special Education Profiles

The Department will release the 2022-2023 Special Education Profiles for all districts and community schools soon. The Special Education Profile displays the district's performance on key indicators established by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and informs the district of any required activities based on these indicators. Districts must complete all required activities based on these indicators. Districts must complete all required activities detailed in the Special Education Profile to demonstrate compliance with IDEA.

The Department is releasing the 2022-2023 Special Education Profiles in two phases:

- The upcoming first release contains all indicators that may have required actions. This includes compliance, disproportionality and survey indicators. Phase 1 includes exiting indicators and may have required actions for the first time this year.
- The second release, targeted for May 2023, will add informational student-outcome indicators that do not have required actions.

The Department will email notifications to superintendents, special education contacts and community school sponsors when profiles are available. Profiles will be available through the OH ID Portal. Updates on the New School Safety **Plan Portal**

As the Ohio School Safety Center is working on getting ready to implement the new school safety plan portal in Spring 2023, they are updating resubmission dates to better realign within districts and the school safety zones. Over the next couple weeks, if you receive a compliant email outside of your resubmission cycle, your future resubmission date has been modified. This is no cause for concern, and you have nothing due at this time. If you would like to check your schools resubmit date, review the right column "resubmit date" when looking up your school in the current school safety plan portal.

EMERGENCY DRILL LOGS ARE NOW ONLINE!

The State Fire Marshall has provided an update regarding a school's requirement to complete and submit a record of emergency evacuation drills log. The new requirement is that each school must create an account on the Ohio State Fire Marshall-Code Enforcement Portal and log the drills that would have typically been documented on the paper drill log. Legal Team Update - Contract Renewals

Next year, eighteen (18) of our sponsored schools will be going through the renewal process. For those that will be going through the renewal process next year and years to come, here is a bird's eye view of what to expect.

The Renewal Process generally begins in September when the state report cards are released. Once the state report cards are released, CSS begins scoring the data and assembling the renewal report which are identical to the annual report that you have just received for your school. At the same time, the school completes a renewal application and submits it to the sponsor. Each school must be eligible and score 75% of the total points available between the renewal report and the application. For more detailed information on this renewal process, refer to the Contract Performance Measures section of your charter school contract in Article XI, General Provisions.

We encourage all of our schools that are up for renewal next year, to thoroughly review and discuss the annual report that you just received in anticipation of the upcoming renewal process.

Armed School Staff Essential Training Program (ASSET)

Legislated under the 134th General Assembly, House Bill 99 permits a school district board or governing body to elect to arm specific staff members as well as the mandated training requirements for those individuals.

The same legislation created the Ohio Mobile Training Team (OMTT), within the Ohio School Safety Center (OSSC) who must create and provide required initial and annual requalification training for armed school staff.

The OMTTs model curriculum is called, Armed School Staff Essential Training (ASSET). The ASSET program is comprised of two core training programs, the initial, 24-hour certification program and the annual, 8-hour requalification program.

Federal Programs Reminder for January

Happy New Year from Federal Programs!

Most of us start the new year with resolutions or plans for the year. Your Federal Programs should also start with plans. First, where is the school in the process of completing all the required activities? As a reminder, the list of required activities can be found <u>HERE</u>.

Another New Year's Resolution, should be to expend all the ESSER II funds and as many of the ARP ESSER funds. The ESSER II funds expire on September 30, 2023. The ARP ESSER funds do not expire until September 30, 2024.

Keep in mind that schools must evaluate the intervention programs (Title I, Title III) and other programs funded by federal funds (Title II, Title IV, IDEA). Along with student achievement, parent and student surveys should be analyzed to determine program success. There are examples of surveys located on our website under Federal Programs.

Submit Grade 3 Paper Testing Resolution for 2023-2024 by May 1
