ODEW wants to remind schools that the deadline for all eligible educators to complete required professional development in the science of reading is June 30.

ODEW's <u>Professional Development in the Science of Reading</u> webpage provides information on which educators must take the course, selecting the most appropriate course pathway from the Department's Introduction to the Science of Reading courses, and the stipend process.

To qualify for the stipend, educators must finish all parts of the Introduction to the Science of Reading course, including the post-assessment, by 11:59 p.m. on June 30. No exceptions will be made for late completions or technical issues near the

Supreme Court Blocks the Nation's First Religious Public Charter School

On April 30, the U.S. Supreme Court heard oral arguments regarding an application for the nation's first religious charter school. St. Isidore of Seville had applied for a virtual Catholic school to be opened in Oklahoma. The application was initially approved by the Oklahoma Statewide Charter School Board in 2023, and opponents of the application filed a lawsuit challenging the approval of the application. The case made its way to the Oklahoma Supreme Court, and that court denied the application, ruling that St. Isidore was applying to be a public charter school and therefore under state law was required to be secular. On May 22, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its ruling, a 4-4 decision. The result of the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling leaves the decision by the Oklahoma Supreme Court in place, holding that charter schools are public schools and are required to remain secular. Religious charter schools are not permitted to open and operate. Although a 4-4 vote signals that there may be future challenges to the secular nature of public schools, the finding reiterates that charter schools are in fact public schools.

Federal Programs - June Reminders

As the fiscal year winds down for the 2024-2025 school year, please remember to retain records of all the activities you did this year using federal funds. Below is a short list of activities that should be completed at the close of the school year:

- Make sure to get signed Semi-Annual Certifications from any individual paid with federal funds. It must be dated on or after the last day
 the individual worked.
- Make sure that the Self-Evaluations for ESEA Grants (Title II, Title III, Title III, Title IV, IDEA, ECSE, School Improvement and EOEC) have been completed before June 30.
- Check to make sure the inventory of items purchased with federal funds is current (within the last 2 years). If your inventory has not been updated within the last 2 years, conduct a physical inventory.
- Check with your treasurer to ensure that your school will not exceed the 15% carryover limit in Title I funds. If you have more than 15% of the original, additional, and reallocated funds, check with your federal programs consultant to see if your school qualifies for the Title I Carryover Waiver.

Schools who did not have this information posted on their website might have received an Improvement Plan from OEC regarding this requirement. Moonshot Museum Launches a Three Year Partnership with Green Inspiration Academy

Through the power of immersive learning, Moonshot Museum transported students at Green Inspiration Academy into the future of space exploration during a two-hour, in-school experience on May 14. This hands-on program engages 5th through 8th grade students in a series of interactive stations focused on space science, virtual exploration, and coding — all designed to spark curiosity and

connect classroom learning to real-world careers in the space industry.

Made possible through the museum's NASA TEAM II Award, the experience reflects Moonshot Museum's mission to inspire young people to see themselves in the future of space, no matter their background or zip code.
